Maths & Numeracy

From now until June, all groups are being encouraged, through their programmes of work, to develop problem solving skills, apply their learning and work more independently. Topics covered will include: BODMAS, negative numbers, square numbers and roots and much more!! We have a lot to cover to ensure all children are ready for S1.

Homework is an important part of learning as it reflects and compliments work done in class. As well as set homework, we would encourage your child to access **Sumdog** and **Maths Workout** online regularly to revise and consolidate their learning. We thank you for your continued support in ensuring that tasks are completed on time.



Language & Literacy



As part of the transition process for S1, Primary 7 will be working on a novel study, as well as working with staff from Kyle on a number of occasions.

The project will involve a range of literacy skills including: interrogating a text, comprehension, inference, themes, summarising and paraphrasing etc.

At this stage in Primary 7 we are encouraging pupils to check their work and up level their writing through the use of various VCOP skills. A homework task will be issued which asks pupils to review a film or a book. This will be presented to the class and we would encourage pupils to practise presenting within a set time, using only cue cards.

Other Class Information

As part of our science programme of study we are investigating Blood, Bones and Bodies. Alongside this, we shall be looking at how to keep fit and healthy, and developing life skills such as cooking for health. Later this term, we will be revising parts of the body and changes which happen at puberty. We will then progress to reproduction. It is hard to believe that we are nearly at the end of the year and we will soon start work on our leavers' assembly when we come back from Inverclyde.
