Having been in to our meeting I feel much better about my daughter's progress. I feel more feedback on our children's progress in the school year would be helpful.
- Report cards this year were very vague.
- Offer pupils alternative clubs that don't just focus on sports or music i.e. computer programming, science clubs etc. Also transition to Kyle could have had a varied subject or interest other than just sport.
- Change the report cards.
- Less form signing one for the full year please.
- Leavers Hoodies before the P7 trip to Inverciyde like other years had to buy another hoodie as we were expecting to use the leavers one.
- I am not a fan of the new style school report cards and feel that it should revert to the old style or at least give more feedback on my child as an individual.
- Amend report card more teacher's comments.
- Report cards need comments they are too generic and the fact they need a booklet to make them make sense is not right. Still need clarified even after the booklet.
- Report card not informative more information is required not just tick marks.
- More parents evenings.
- Annual prize giving (not just sports day).
- More information (e.g. comment box) on the report cards to gain a better understanding of my child's progress.
- Give the kids the leavers' hoodies earlier (all other schools do).
