

Information for Primary 7 Parents.

This sheet provides you with information about what your child will be learning this term, and shows next steps in their learning. We would encourage you to talk about this with your child, and where possible, to assist them with their learning at home.

Maths & Numeracy

In Primary 7, all groups are continuing to work hard on 'Big Maths' CLINT sessions and shall complete their Money Sense topic.

The main focus this term is on fractions, decimals and percentages. To make progress with this, pupils really need to have a sound grasp of their tables and number bonds. It would be helpful if you could support your child with this at home.

In addition to fractions, decimals and percentages, pupils will be learning about pie charts and number sequences.

All homework tasks will consolidate class learning. These will be issued on Monday and will be expected to be completed to a high standard for Thursday. Homework tasks will be a variety of written and online activities.



Language & Literacy

Primary 7 are continuing to work on up levelling their use of adjectives and adverbs to improve their writing. We are focusing on imaginative and persuasive writing this term.

We shall finish reading 'Goodnight Mr Tom' this term, which is linked to our WW2 topic. We will continue to use this as a stimulus for some writing and comprehension tasks, such as summarising and paraphrasing.

Bug Club will commence this term and the children will be asked to complete homework tasks online. Spelling homework will be issued on a Monday to be returned on a Thursday ahead of our spelling test on a Friday.



Other Class Information

This term, Primary 7 shall complete the interdisciplinary topic, "WW2". Following this, the children will delve into the world of Democracy and learn what it means to be part of a political party and produce a manifesto for their own 'political party'. This term we shall continue Sumdog and start Bug Club homework. If children experience any difficulties completing this, then we strongly advise that they make use of Homework Club, which takes place every Thursday at 1pm.
