


Information for Primary 7 Parents.

This sheet provides you with information about what your child will be learning this term, and shows next steps in their learning. We would encourage you to talk about this with your child, and where possible, to assist them with their learning at home.

Maths & Numeracy

In Primary 7, all groups are working very hard on 'Big Maths' CLINT sessions. (Ask your child about this!) We are revising our 'Learn Its' which we should know by this stage. Pupils really need to have a sound grasp of their tables and number bonds. It would be helpful if you could support your child with this.

The focus for this term will be decimals and money. In addition to this, the 'Money Sense' programme of work will be used to embed learning in a real life situation. This involves looking at how we use credit cards, debit cards and how to avoid debt. Due to current guidelines, this term Maths homework tasks will be carried out on Sumdog and Education City and will be issued every Monday for completion by Friday.



Language & Literacy



Primary 7 are working on VCOP skills in order to give them the tools they need to improve their writing. Within Grammar, we will be developing our knowledge of direct and indirect speech, apostrophes, commas and parts of speech. We are focusing on functional and personal writing this term.

We are reading 'Goodnight Mr Tom'. This is linked to our WW2 topic and reading comprehension strategies. We will be closely interrogating the text and will use this as a stimulus for many pieces of writing. Weekly spelling words will be focussed on in class, prior to our spelling test on a Friday. Handwriting continues to be carried out weekly to further develop our presentation and layout.

Other Class Information

This term, Primary 7 are working on our interdisciplinary topic, "WW2". We will be designing and building papier maché Spitfire planes, so would ask that pupils bring in newspapers. PE days for 7S are Wednesday and Thursday. P7M will have PE on a Wednesday and Friday. Homework, although online, is closely planned and tracked and is an important part of young people's learning and supports what we are doing in the classroom.
